GENERAL INFORMATION

St. John Neumann Regional Academy is a co-educational Roman Catholic institution which is open to students, grades preschool-12. Parents, pastors, teachers, administration, staff and students form a school community of faith enlivened by the Gospel spirit of responsible freedom and charity.

Enrollment at the high school campus is approximately 130 elite students with an average graduating class of 22 who are groomed for higher education placement. Our teaching staff includes 19 lay teachers and 1 priest all supervised by the Diocese of Scranton Office for Catholic Schools and the Bishop of Scranton.

Our academy's Catholic school education has been thriving in Lycoming County for more than 130 years, enlightening thousands of students with the gift of an academically and spiritually challenging education. The primary mission of St. John Neumann Regional Academy is the education of faith-filled, knowledgeable and healthy young people. Because of our religious nature, the entire formative process takes place in a climate of love and hope. A Christian sense of commitment is expressed and understood through the content of the academic curriculum and in every other dimension of school life. St. John Neumann Regional Academy strives to develop within students a sense of respect for themselves (body and spirit), their community and their country, society and the responsibilities which accompany these freedoms. CURRICULUM

The curriculum at St. John Neumann Regional Academy is designed to provide academic training to students preparing for college or other post-secondary education. The basic unit of academic work is the semester, and the school year is divided into 2 eighteen-week semesters. The normal course load is 6 major subjects per year plus required electives. On the grading scale of 40-100, the passing grade is 70, with the honor grade of 90 and the high honor grade of 95.

HONORS COURSES

Honors courses are offered in every major academic discipline; in grades 9 through 12. Honors courses are designated by H and/or Level 4 on the transcript. Advanced Placement courses are offered in English Language, English Literature, U. S. Government, U.S History, Biology, Physics, Calculus, and European History. They are designated by course title on the transcript and are noted at level 5.

COMPILING GPA

- Only major subjects are used to determine grade point average. Major subjects are courses that meet four or more times per week.
- Weighted grades are used when computing GPA
- Grade point average is cumulative including grades 9 – 12
- **GPA is determined by the grade received and the relative value of the subject according to the course level.**
- **Graduation honors are determined by grades received through the second quarter of the senior year.**
- **Due to the small number of graduates, students will not receive a class rank. All honors, awards, and scholarships will be based on Grade Point Average.**
